# *ArcGIS Pro*

- Part of ArcGIS 10.3 for Desktop
- Missing some functionality of ArcMap
- Offers combined 2D/3D visualization
- 64-bit support
- Multiple layout support
- Project based workflows
- Can import map documents (.mxd), scenes (.sxd), and globes (.3DD)





# *Why ArcGIS Pro?*

- Takes functionality from ArcMap/Globe/Scene and merges into 1 application
- Integration with ArcGIS Online
- Streamlined interface and map workflow

## *Why Not....*

- Cannot publish to ArcGIS Server
- Cannot use data in personal geodatabases (Microsoft Access is 32-bit)
- Some extensions are missing (Schematics, Tracking and Geostatistical Analyst)



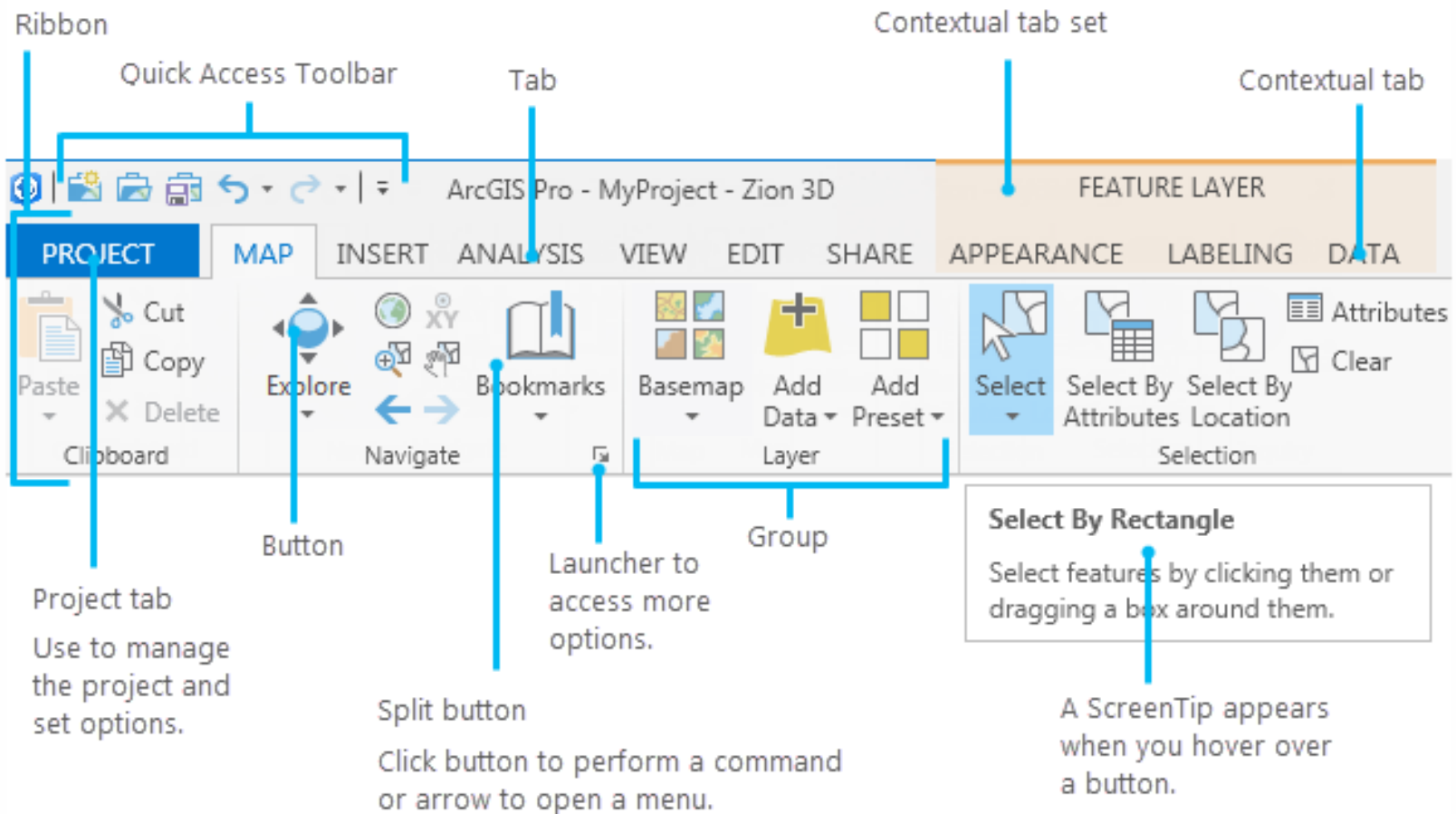


# *ArcGIS Pro Licensing*

- Must have license for ArcGIS for Desktop
- ArcGIS Pro has 3 versions like Desktop: Basic, Standard, and Advanced
- Licensed extensions can be used with ArcGIS Pro
- Must have ArcGIS Online for Organization Account
- A member is assigned one license level along with any extensions
- Licenses can be reassigned as often as needed and changes takes place immediately
- Members can also check out license to authorize ArcGIS Pro for use in a disconnected environment



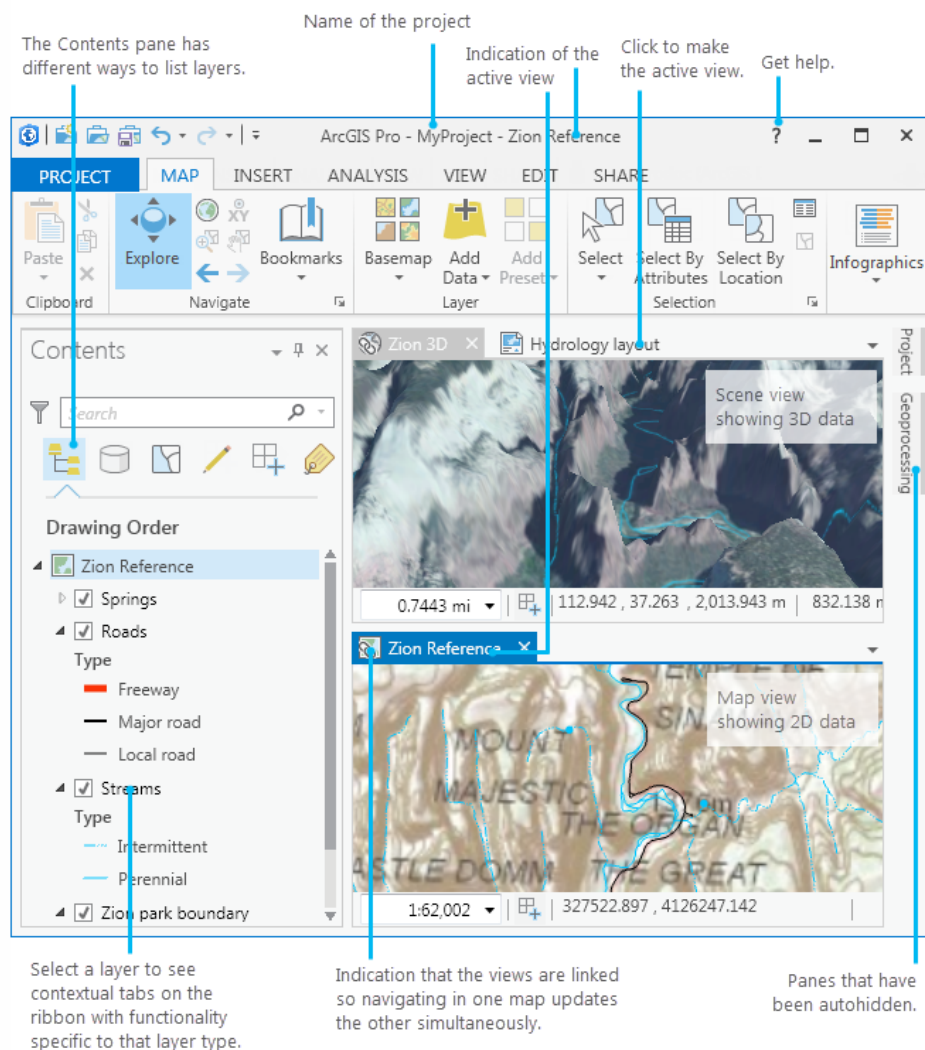
# ArcGIS Pro User Interface
